# Primary Activities



## GANDHI JAYANTI CELEBRATION

We celebrate Gandhi Jayanti on 2<sup>nd</sup> October every year in remembrance of our beloved Father of Nation. This year 2021 is remarked as 152<sup>nd</sup> birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. We recall his struggles for getting us free India and pay our heartfelt tribute to Gandhi ji for all his sacrifices made for the country.

Being at home during online classes, there has been a regular and rigorous instructions to the students for dynamic contribution to celebrate this Grand Day. 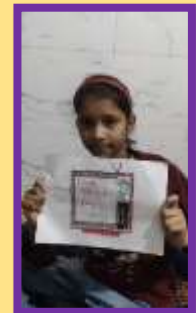
The students of class IV to VIII were asked to make posters and write slogans on the importance of this day. The girl students were encouraged to dress up as any famous women personality and speak few lines about it.

As an endeavor to solidify the bond of oneness and unification, the Birth Anniversary of Sardar Vallabhai Patel was honoured on 31<sup>st</sup> October as Rastriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day).

### NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY

National Mathematics Day is observed every year on 22<sup>nd</sup> December. The day marks the birth anniversary of the Great Mathematician **Srinivasa Ramanujan**. Though he had almost no formal training in pure mathematics, he made substantial contributions to mathematical analysis, number theory, infinite series, and continued fractions, including solutions to mathematical problems then considered unsolvable.
