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Overall Activities

Van Mahotsav Celebration

Janmashtami Celebration

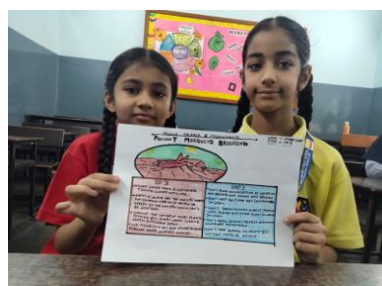

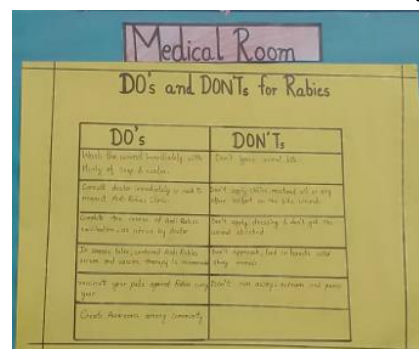


It was also significant in making students aware about the facts of the viral disease which is caused by the
